## 2025 Cornucopia Scholastic Chess Tournament November 8, 2025



In celebration of the birth of Nebraska Scholastic chess in 1965, the UNL Chess Club and Lincoln Chess Foundation present the 2025 Cornucopia Scholastic Chess Tournament on Saturday November 8<sup>th</sup> at the UNL Student Union Ballroom on the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor at 1400 R Street in Lincoln.

Held in 4 sections.

K-5, 6-8 and 9-12 are all 4 round Swiss System events depending on numbers, and are both a team and an individual unrated tournament not requiring USCF membership. EF for all sections in advance by 11/7/2025 is \$10.00 per player. Or \$40.00 for a team of 4. Each additional player beyond 4 is only \$7.00 per player in advance. Late entries cause delays and are generally discouraged so the price rises to \$12.00 per player and \$48.00 for a team on site.

Open Section: 3 or 4 round Swiss depending on numbers. USCF membership is required EF is \$15.00 in advance by 11/7/2025 and \$20.00 on site.

Registration on site begins at 10 AM with 1<sup>st</sup> round set for 10:30 in the Open and High School and 11:00 AM in the middle school and elementary sections.

Time controls: Elementary and Middle School both G/30; d5 with rounds at 11:00, Lunch 12:15-1:15 pm, 1:30, 3 pm and round 4 will follow immediately after the end of round 3.

Time controls: High School and Open G/50; d5 with round 1 at 10:30, Lunch 12:30-1:00, Round 2 1:00, Round 3 at 2:45 PM and round 4, if necessary, at 4:45 PM or immediately after the conclusion the previous round. Director reserves the right to shorten the time control in the last round if the Union is closing at 7 PM.

Prizes: Open: Trophies to 1st, 2nd 1st Under 1400, top Nebraska woman and top University Student.

High School, Middle School and Elementary Trophies to 1<sup>st</sup> & 2<sup>nd</sup> Individual and 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> team in each section.

UNL requires parental permission to attend an organized event on their campus for any minors. Parents can sign this form electronically at the following hyperlink: Parents do NOT have to personally attend the event although obviously we would ask that young children have at least one coach or parent supervising for each team. That very first scholastic was only open to high schools and was won by Omaha Central led by Don Rodgers. Be a part of history come out and experience team chess now still going strong 60 years later.

Coaches, please make sure that your students have their parent or guardian sign the permission slip and return it electronically. Only minors under 18 years of age need parental permission. Adults and people over 18 do not need to sign the permission slip.
